INDUSTRY LIAISON REPORT

Hello Skiers and Riders: There is now only one North American resort still offering skiing and riding, that being Timberline Ski Area at Government Camp, OR. Mammoth Mountain closed for the season after skiing/riding on Sunday July 28. But, the industry news that most of us are waiting for is the decision regarding the plan to connect Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows via a gondola tramway.

Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows Connection:

The Placer County Board of Supervisors has unanimously approved the "Base-to-Base" Gondola connecting Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows. The new California Express Gondola will have terminals near the base of Red Dog at Squaw Valley and the base area of Alpine Meadows with mid-stations on Saddle run near the KT-22 patrol shack and another at White Wolf. The Red Dog chair base terminal will be moved just southeast near Red Wolf Lodge. The new scenic connection will allow skiers to travel between the ski base areas without having to go by vehicle.

"Under the alternative chosen, the lift will be configured as an eight-passenger gondola and have a design capacity of approximately 1,400 persons per hour in each direction. In total, the lift would be roughly 11,700 feet in length (based on plan length), of which approximately 2,300 feet (20 percent) would be sited on National Forest Service lands, including the Alpine Meadows

base terminal. A total of 33 towers would be installed along the gondola alignment, with 28 on private land and five on NFS lands." From—[Placer County Final Environmental Impact Report](#): Squaw Valley Alpine Meadows Base-to-Base Gondola Project. And, from the Chief Operations Officer of Squaw Valley/Alpine Meadows: *"After successfully obtaining preliminary approval from the Tahoe National Forest earlier this year, the unanimous approval by the Placer County Board of Supervisors represents one of the last crucial steps towards connecting Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows. This base-to-base gondola connection will tremendously enhance the skier experience, uniting our 6,000 acres of terrain without the need for a car. Moreover, the chosen alignment arrived at through this long and detailed process is the most environmentally favorable plan and is also the alignment which is located furthest away from the Wilderness boundary. I'd like to thank all of the staff of the many agencies involved in the comprehensive study and review of this project – their tireless effort ensured that the best possible project moved forward. I'd also like to thank the thousands of Squaw Valley and Alpine Meadows skiers and riders who signed petitions in support."* - Ron Cohen, President and COO, Squaw Valley Alpine Meadows

The report estimates that it will take 10 weeks to complete construction. A date has not been set regarding the commencement of construction.

Report On Visitor Spending in Tahoe-

Truckee: "Spring skiing supported steady growth in visitor spending in Tahoe-Truckee: The growth in tourism this winter backed by heavy snowfall carried into the spring, with the opportunity to ski and swim in the same day----. People (could) get out on the mountain on the morning and then go experience the lake on the same day," said Liz Bowling, director of communications for the North Lake Tahoe Resort Association. "We focus a lot of our efforts on the fact that people can experience those dual days," she said. "When the weather is there we capitalize on that as much as possible." Squaw Valley totaled 719 inches of snow at upper mountain this season, with a record-setting 315 inches of snowfall in February. This allowed the mountain to stay open until July 7.

"The spring is a little more dependent on weather. You never know what you're going to have," said Sarah Winters, sales director for North Lake

Tahoe Resort Association.

Data collected from the resort association showed occupancy in North Lake Tahoe was up 9.3% in April compared to the same month last year. From November, 2018 to April, 2019, the occupancy rate was up 17.5% from November, 2017 to April, 2018. "We did have a longer winter so people were really able to plan and look at when they could come up," said Winters. Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) collection from April to June totaled \$3.8 million, up 15% from the same period last year, an increase of \$519,000. Tax collection from January through March was up 12% from that period last year, a \$773,000 increase, totaling \$6.8 million. In the last decade there has been steady growth in TOT collection during every quarter, with larger increases during the shoulder seasons (Spring and Autumn). As visitation in the summer and winter is typically high, Bowling said the resort association tends to focus on the "shoulder seasons" in the fall and spring, which runs from October to December and from April to June. Along with WinterWonderGrass, which attracted nearly 5,000 visitors in 2018, the resort association sponsors other events that pull in visitors during the shoulder seasons like the Autumn Food and Wine Festival and sporting events like the Spartan World Championship. According to Amber Burke, director of marketing for the resort association, their website traffic also saw an increase in traffic in June.

More industry news: **Vail Resorts to Acquire Peak Resorts, Owner of 17 U.S. Ski Areas:** (From BROOMFIELD, Colo., July 22, 2019 /PRNewswire): Vail Resorts, Inc. announced it has entered into a definitive merger agreement to acquire 100 percent of the outstanding stock of **Peak Resorts, Inc.** ([SKIS](#)) at a purchase price of \$11.00 per share, subject to certain conditions, including regulatory review and Peak Resorts' shareholder approval. Through the acquisition, Vail Resorts will add 17 U.S. ski areas to its network of resorts including: **Mount Snow** in Vermont, **Hunter Mountain** in New York, **Attitash Mountain Resort**, **Wildcat Mountain** and **Crotched Mountain** in New Hampshire, **Liberty Mountain Resort**, **Roundtop Mountain Resort**, **Whitetail Resort**, **Jack Frost** and **Big Boulder** in Pennsylvania, **Alpine Valley**, **Boston Mills**, **Brandywine** and **Mad River Mountain** in Ohio, **Hidden Valley** and **Snow Creek** in Missouri and **Paoli Peaks** in Indiana. When the transaction closes, the 2019-20 Epic Pass, Epic Local Pass and Military Epic Pass will include unlimited and unrestricted access to the 17 Peak Resorts ski areas. Guests with an Epic Day Pass will also be able to access the new member ski areas as a part of the total number of days purchased. For the 2019-20 season, Vail Resorts will honor and continue to sell all Peak Resorts pass products, and Peak Resorts' pass holders will have the option to upgrade to an Epic Pass or Epic Local Pass following closing of the transaction. The transaction was approved by both companies' Board of Directors, and the Peak Resorts Board of Directors also recommends that Peak Resorts' shareholders approve the transaction. The transaction is expected to close this fall. The parties expect operations at all Peak Resorts ski areas to continue in the ordinary course of business. Upon closing, Vail Resorts plans to retain the vast majority of

each resort's employees.

In case you have not heard, **Delta Airlines** has eliminated special fees for Sporting Equipment Including Skis and Bikes. This information was first posted by [UnofficialNet](#) on July 19, 2019: "Delta customers traveling with surfboards, bicycles, golf clubs, scuba gear and other large-sized sporting equipment will now be allowed to check them as part of their standard baggage allowance. The airline is eliminating the \$150 specialty sports bag fee previously charged for these items, which was effective for travel worldwide on tickets purchased beginning July 17, 2019. Customers are now paying a first, second or third checked bag fee according to the fare rules associated with their booking and/or SkyMiles Medallion status. Complete checked baggage fee detail, including the new sporting equipment fees, can be found at Delta.com." Delta is the third major airline behind American and Alaskan Airlines to remove the high baggage fee for sporting equipment. (Posted from Unofficial Networks via Facebook)

China is the country selected to host the 2022 Winter Olympic Games. China has a vision of the future that includes hundreds of millions of Chinese participating in winter sports. That's what the International Olympic Committee Evaluation Commission was told during a recent visit to Beijing, the host city for the 2022 Winter Olympic Games. "Beijing 2022 has a vision to engage 300 million people in winter sports by then. "We can see real benefits resulting from the various actions that are being undertaken across the country to reach this goal," according to IOC Coordination Commission Chair Juan Antonio Samaranch. "We have heard about some impressive developments this week that exemplify the vision for winter sports in China in terms of mass participation--- and tourism. This progress is very encouraging for the long-term future of winter sports, both in China and internationally."

"The only problem is that Beijing and the mountains where the ski events will be held receive basically no snowfall. In fact, the area that will be hosting the ski events averages a snowpack of just 2 inches, making the 2022 games the **first Winter Olympics to be held on 100% man-made snow.**"

To bring onboard 300 million new winter sports enthusiasts, the nation has built 742 ski resorts and 596 ice rinks throughout the country. Currently, there are estimated to be just over 8 million people taking part in winter sports events in China (out of a total country population of a billion plus).

FWSA Historic Ski Club Designation



The FWSA Historic Ski Club designation is bestowed on Ski Clubs & Councils that have met the requirements of 50+ years in operation. Presently there are 24 clubs that are recognized as an FWSA Historic Ski Club/Council. In January 2019, the Nisei Ski Club (NSC) began research to provide the FWSA the required documentation in order to be considered for this honored designation. NSC was founded in 1958 and last year we celebrated our 60th anniversary. However, the club was not officially incorporated as a non-

profit club until 1968, and thus NSC qualified with 50+ years. NSC also received an official FWSA Historic Ski Club certificate. Sandy Kiyomura, NSC board member, initially worked with FWSA in securing this honor, and then Frank Chang, NSC treasurer, continued to work on this effort while Sandy was enjoying herself on the FWSA Japan trip in March. Thanks to their dedicated efforts NSC was awarded the FWSA Historic Ski Club designation, and is currently the only ski club in the Bay Area Council (BAC) to received this designation. 
